Dr Diya Dutt, Deputy Director, United State-India Educational Foundation, New Delhi inaugurated Summer Classes of Persian.

Dr Dutt in her inaugural speech introduced the educational activities of USIEF under Fulbright programmes. She said that US government in 2006 started a critical language enhancement programme for young Americans to master foreign languages. In 2008, India became an equal funding partner to this programme and has emerged as one of the largest Fulbright programmes in the world. She further stated that the main objective for introducing the programme is to build up national security and strengthen international relations with other countries. Thirteen languages including Persian, Urdu, and Panjabi have been specified for the programme to train the students in knowing language and culture of the particular region.

Professor Husain in his presidential remarks emphasized on not only the need of learning Persian language but also culture and civilization of Persian speaking countries. He said that culture makes a language efficient and sweet. Therefore, only speaking a language is not enough but to understand culture and literature through the medium of language fulfills the objective of learning a particular language. He further added that IIPS has designed its syllabus for Persian Summer Classes focusing not only on Persian language but on Indo-Persian literature and culture, too. Dr Husain also thanked Dr Pardis Minuchehr, coordinator of Persian Programme, George Washington University, USA for cooperating with IIPS to host the Persian classes in India.
